Introduction

Our academic model stems from 6 important elements of our organization- our vision, our core values, our promise, our definitions of learning and international mindedness, our non-negotiables and our traditions.

Vision: To be the best stepping stone for future world citizens

Values: Progressiveness, Energy, Respect

Promise: Every child is visible, challenged and successful

Learning:

Learning is a continuing journey of curiosity, challenge and discovery that expands our knowledge, improves our skills and deepens our understanding.

International mindedness:

International mindedness is to know ourselves and our own values so that we have the ability to appreciate differences and similarities across cultures and have the mindset to embrace the diversity among us.

Non-Negotiables:

At Futuraskolan International preschools and schools the following applies:

- We are bilingual (Swedish, English)
- The IPC/IMYC is the basis for our learning model
- IPC/IMYC Personal Goals and Dispositions are utilized to promote International mindedness
- We work collaboratively, with Progressiveness, Energy and Respect
- Our students and staff are Visible, Challenged and Successful

Traditions

Ways in which our different schools can work together and celebrate common traditions and global perspectives. To give our students the sense that they are part of a bigger Futuraskolan International Community and to a larger world community. Currently, we have six events that we hold with all of our schools:
